

## Cornish Rex

<b>HEAD</b>	Medium wedge, narrowing to a firm chin. Flat skull. Profile slightly convex. Straight line from end of nose to chin
<b>EARS</b>	Large, set rather high on head, wide at base, tapering to rounded tips. Particularly in adults, the ears may be without hair, and the cat should not be penalised on this account if good in other respects.
<b>EYES</b>	Oval shape, medium in size
<b>BODY</b>	Hard and muscular, slender, elegant and medium in size. Males proportionately larger.
<b>LEGS</b>	Long, slender and straight, giving an overall appearance of being high on the legs.
<b>PAWS</b>	Dainty, small and oval
<b>TAIL</b>	Long, fine and tapering
<b>COAT</b>	Short, dense and soft, without guard hairs. Should curl, wave or ripple, particularly on back and tail. Whiskers and eyebrows of good length, and may be gently curved or crinkled
<b>EYE COLOUR</b>	Any colour acceptable
<b>COAT COLOUR</b>	All coat colours acceptable
