Message from the SACC President, Jan van Rooyen

Dear SACC Members

The year is in full swing and I am glad to say that all the cat events have been and are running smoothly and successfully. Feedback so far is that it is a busy cat year, but thoroughly enjoyed by those that are taking part. The SACC members just celebrated the 2008 Cat of the Year event and my heartiest congratulations to all the winners. Further on in this newsletter you will read more about the winners. Congratulations to Alison Renwick and Jane Goble being the owners and breeders of Cream Burmese female, SP CH Onaoan Maid by Eve, who is South Africa's Cat of the Year for 2008. A personal achievement for me as well, being a Burmese breeder and exhibitor, I am very happy that a Burmese could do it again after 15 years. Also congratulations to TCS the hosts for this year and for putting up such a memorable event. COTY is such an important event on our SACC calendar and it remains that esteemed title any serious exhibitor would like to win. The TOP 5 cats in each section were also the top cats that featured as winners at most shows during the year, showing me that the SACC judges are on par with their international colleagues.

In between organizing COTY, the clubs also managed to run their annual shows. I was lucky enough to attend shows in most regions

and thank the clubs for the friendliness bestowed upon me in each region. I am impressed with the quality of cats being exhibited at all shows and knows that the 2009 COTY will be a similarly competitive event.

I am proud to announce that SACC management introduced a business meeting apart from the Annual General Meeting. The objective of this meeting to discuss business matters that the SACC Management does not really have time for at the AGM. A very successful meeting was held on 18 May 2008. One of the biggest issues the SACC Management had to address was how to deal with complaints in the absence of an Ethics Committee. Some of you might be aware that no ethics committee was proposed at the last AGM, leaving a gap in how complaints will be handled. After this issue was work-shopped in detail at the business meeting an interim process was formalized and a final and workable system will be put in place at the 2009 AGM.

Ingrid de Wet represented me and SACC at the World Cat Congress in Houston, Texas in March 2008. I unfortunately had to withdraw from this event this year due to personal reasons and am very grateful that Ingrid could take time to attend. A short report on her experiences is included in this newsletter. I remain proud of SACC's membership of WCC as it is really an opportunity for the management of cat fanciers to discuss common problems and to find workable solutions. Recently SACC added its name to other world organizations in a petition to the Chinese Government on the inhumane way in which cats were removed from Beijing in preparation for the 2008 Olympics.

The WCC will be held in April 2009 in The Netherlands. The plan is that a few SACC members will accompany me next year. The congress is open to any members of member bodies and is a 3 day event. The 1st day is usually a seminar on related cat topics and a lot of well known people in the veterinary world have given lectures at this event before. The congress is always run in conjunction with a world show hosted by one of the member organizations. Members that have the money and time and would like to attend the congress in April 2009 are welcome to contact me in September. The SACC management is currently investigating the possibility to bring WCC to South Africa. I know our members will then truly experience what membership to this organization means.

In the second half of the year when shows become fewer it is also the time for the SACC clubs to prepare themselves for the AGM in October 2008. The only way for anyone to ensure that issues are heard and addressed is through your club. SACC will be facing more challenges in the year to come and the biggest one is the current economic situation in the world. These challenges are not unique to SACC and South Africa, but it require from the SACC Management to restructure and optimize our current processes. Cost saving and strict cost cutting policies need to be implemented to ensure that SACC will still be able to provide the necessary services. It is our policy not to increase the cost for registrations, but it might become necessary to start charging for services that were free up to now. Registration at R20 a kitten in SACC is still relatively cheap comparing to \$20 registrations in the USA and €20 in Europe. The clubs therefore require your

support in this difficult task lying ahead to ensure that SACC can support itself and remain self-sufficient in the future. All I can say is thank you to the delegates and management committee for the support to ensure that SACC goes from strength to strength.

DM Status

Breeders and Members are reminded that they can apply for a DM (Distinguished Merit) title for their cats. The following are applicable to application:

The DM system is based on a point system for titles obtained, based on the total value of the progeny of status of a particular cat.

The following status will count towards a DM Title for the parents:
Champion/Premier: 1 point
Grand Champion/Premier: 2 points
Supreme Champion/Premier: 3 points.

Progeny of status to the total value of 30 points earn a male the DM title.
Progeny of status to the total value of 10 points earn a female the DM title.
Only the highest title obtained by a particular cat will count towards DM status for its parents (i.e. a Supreme Champion earns its parents 3 points, not 1+2+3 points).

If your application for the title of DM for your cat has been successful, the SACR will issue you with a DM title certificate and the letters DM will be added as a suffix to their registered names.

In General

Breeders are requested to please use the 1997 Breed and Colour Codes when registering Kittens.

Changes to Registration and Breeding Rules

No breed that has been developed out of a non-domestic wild cat breed may be registered with SACC unless the wild ancestor is at least four generations back from the cat being registered. That means the wild ancestor must be the great - great grand parent at least. *This rule means that in the case of Bengals, any imported cat or new litter must be at least be 4 generations away from the original wild cat.*

No new breeds with non domestic ancestors will be accepted into SACC for future registration, breeding and exhibiting at shows. *CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora) considers animals who in their*

recent lineage have one or more specimens of species included in a CITES Appendix to be subject to the PROVISIONS of CITES. Recent lineage is interpreted to refer to the previous FOUR generations (i.e. F4). That means animals would likely be classified as wild until after the 4th generation.

Only 4 generation pedigrees will be accepted. *In the past 3 generation pedigrees were accepted. This will not be the case anymore for any cat or litter to be registered.*

Only documentation (pedigrees and registration applications) containing current SACC Breed and Colour codes will be accepted by the SACR. Documentation containing errors will be returned to sender and an additional fee of R10 will be charged to cover postage when next registration is applied for. The pedigrees of imports from other associations will obviously contain other breed/colour codes. These pedigrees will be exempt from this rule.

Non-Pedigreed cats (Domestics) used in Allowable Outcross breeding programs must be registered with the SACR before progeny from them may be registered. This rule applies to all breeds that require / allow the use of non-registered Domestic cats in their breeding programs.

Western Province Cat Club – 60 years

At the age of 60 one might think of retiring – not so WPCC, which is looking forward to the next 60 years of caring about cats.

WPCC was born in February 1948, a year which saw the foundation of many clubs in South Africa. Our first show was held in Newlands on 4 December 1948 – in the open air! There were no cages, but the rules stated that “every exhibit should have a comfortable basket, car or lap in which to sit during the show and be seen by the public.” The mind boggles, especially as many of the early exhibits were Siamese or Siamese type. In fact, “Best on Show” at that first show was a cat of unknown parentage, entered as a Russian Blue, but Mrs Pocock (Chair of the South African Cat Union) suggested that Little Boy’s father could be her own

Siamese stud, who had the run of Muizenberg. How breeding has changed!

From that auspicious start, the non-pedigreed cats’ status declined until, in 1971, during a huge controversy about how to establish breeds which were new to South Africa, Rosa Anderson described them as “step children of the cat fancy.” Up to about that time, non-pedigreed cats could be awarded CCs, and the proposal preventing this was clearly not universally popular! WPCC redressed the situation in 1998 when we introduced Masters Certificates in the Household Pet section.

WPCC has, for most of its existence, had a strong charity focus. Our own in-house charity, the Belger Memorial Fund for Stray Cats, was established in 1958. Belger was a well known exhibit in the Household Pet section of the time.

Our charity exhibitions began, as far as I can establish, in 1971 and have been running at least annually ever since. Early organisers seemed a bit shy of publicising the results, but since 2000 we have raised over R15 000 by the exhibitions alone. This is divided between various cat-related charities. Mention must be made of our regular venue, the Paddocks mall in Milnerton, as well as Hills, who support the exhibitions as well as sponsoring our shows.

The exhibitions are not our only charitable efforts – in fact we don't miss an opportunity of fund raising for unfortunate cats. Our most recent project is a booklet, a collection of stories by our members. The stories were originally published in the Club's magazine, Cats Calling, over a period of many years. The book was given to TEARS to sell for fundraising, and the launch, at our 60th birthday show in May 2008, raised some R1300. If you would like a copy, please contact TEARS directly on 021 785 4482 or tears@tears.org.za. The cost is R20. Hills also supported TEARS in the printing of the book.

One of the big problems faced by the cat fancy is backyard breeders. There is very little that can be done about them directly, as South Africa's animal protection laws are woefully inadequate, so WPCC decided on a different approach. We produce a list of contact people for the various breed groups (who will know who are the good breeders). When we experimentally gave the list to some vet hospitals in the southern suburbs of Cape Town, the response from staff ranged from happy to ecstatic, which showed the need for something like this. We now send out the list periodically, with our regular newsletter, and encourage our members to give them to their local

vets, pet shops etc, where people might ask for referrals to breeders.

The World Cat Congress

Ingrid de Wet, the Breed Council Secretary, representing SACC on the 28th and 31st March 2008 at the World Cat Congress in Houston, Texas in the USA. This was made possible through the generous sponsorship of Royal Canin.

Here is Ingrid's report back:

This year WCC was hosted by the Cat Fanciers' Association. (CFA)

Open Seminar – 28 March 2008

At the open meeting each Cat Fancy's representative had the opportunity to give a presentation introducing their fancy. The nine representatives were called up in

alphabetical order. Seven of the nine did a PowerPoint presentation, and two just gave a verbal explanation of their organizations. This was very interesting, as one got an idea of the scope and membership of the various fancies right there and then.

In SACC's presentation a lot of emphasis was given to COTY as the flagship event of SACC. The presentation also included some of the wild African breeds.

After lunch there were several speakers. One of the more interesting topics was the relevant topic of DNA testing. The WCC sponsor, Royal Canin also did a presentation. The sponsor of the lunch for that particular day gave a talk about the various types of cat litter produced by their company.

Cat Show – 29 to 30 March 2008

This show was hosted and run under the show rules of CFA. Ingrid judged in the shorthair section and became one of the first SACC judges to judge at a CFA show in the USA.

Management Meeting – 31 March 2008

This meeting is attended by the management of each member association. Some of the agenda items were:

1. **Incorporation** of WCC as an organisation.
2. **Code of Ethics.**
3. **Vaccination protocols.**
4. **Artificial Insemination.**
5. **LOOF's membership application.**
6. **Future WCC meetings.**
Future dates were discussed:
 - 2009: WCC will be in Annheim in Holland. A very

big show to be hosted by FIFE.

- 2010: CCC of Australia
- 2011: SACC submitted a tentative bid, but stated it would depend on the sponsorship available.
- 2012 – CFA
- 2013 – GCCF

In conclusion

I was extremely lucky that circumstances come together to give me the opportunity to attend such a congress of cat organisations. I immediately became aware of how very small SACC is in relation to the other fancies. One is inspired to come home and try one's best to see if we cannot get our fancy to grow in new membership.

What also struck me was that in spite of the difference in size, many of the problems and challenges are the same. Thanks to the leadership of Kaai and Jan and the generosity of Royal Canin, delegates from SACC have once again made contact with FIFE after many years and formed relations and alliances with people from both the northern and southern hemispheres. Our delegates were judges and were therefore given the opportunity to judge in the various cities in which the WCC congress was held. In this way the judges learn and are able to let new experiences affect and influence the cat fanciers at grass roots level via a trickle effect that may not be immediately apparent.

SACC should maintain this relationship with WCC and send delegates to attend the yearly meetings as long as there is sponsorship to assist us to attend the meetings.

Here is the delicious recipe of the desert that Pascal Remy made while staying with Penny Steyn during the WODAC weekend.

Cœurs fondants tout chocolate

Ingredients: (4 portions)

- 100 g + 8 square pieces of Dark chocolate
- 3 eggs
- 80 g white sugar
- 50 g butter
- 1 tablespoon + 1 teaspoon of flour

Switch on your oven; thermostat 9 (260°F / 130°C).

Put 100 g chocolate in a bowl with 50 g butter; melt it in a double boiler or just place the bowl in a saucepan having hot water in it.

In a separate bowl, mix eggs, sugar and tablespoon of flour. Then mix in the melted chocolate.

Use 4 buttered and slightly floured (= put some flour on the sides) ramequins (= small bowls). Put in the 4 ramequins 1/3 of the chocolate sauce. Then place 2 square pieces of chocolate in each and cover up with the rest of the chocolate sauce.

Put the ramequins in the oven about 10 minutes.

Turn out on separate plates. Relish while «fondants» are still tepid with a ball of vanilla ice cream.

You can replace the chocolate square pieces with salted toffee. It is to die for in my opinion.
