## Changes to Breed Standards

### Changes to Registration, Show and Breeding Rules

1. No breed that has been developed out of a non- domestic wild cat breed may be registered with SACC unless the wild ancestor is at least four generations back from the cat being registered. That means the wild ancestor must be the great - great grand parent at least. *This rule means that in the case of Bengals, any imported cat or new litter must be at least be 4 generations away from the original wild cat.*
2. No new breeds with non domestic ancestors will be accepted into SACC for future registration, breeding and exhibiting at shows. *CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora) considers animals who in their recent lineage have one or more specimens of species included in a CITES Appendix to be subject to the PROVISIONS of CITES. Recent lineage is interpreted to refer to the previous FOUR generations (i.e. F4). That means animals would likely be classified as wild until after the 4<sup>th</sup> generation.*
3. Only 4 generation pedigrees will be accepted. *In the past 3 generation pedigrees were accepted. This will not be the case anymore for any cat or litter to be registered.*
4. Only documentation (pedigrees and registration applications) containing current SACC Breed and Colour codes will be accepted by the SACR. Documentation containing errors will be returned to sender and an additional fee of R10 will be demanded to cover such postage when next registration is applied for. The pedigrees of imports from other associations will obviously contain other breed/colour codes. These pedigrees will be exempt from this rule.
5. Non-Pedigreed cats (Domestics) used in Allowable Outcross breeding programs must be registered with the SACR before progeny from them may be registered. This rule applies to all breeds that require / allow the use of non-registered Domestic cats in their breeding programs.
  - a. These cats are not required to show a four generation pedigree.
  - b. The colour and pattern of such a cat must be indicated in its breed Code. Breed Code: DOM + colour

code e.g. Black & white cat = DOM05&W.

- c. All kittens from outcross breeding programs should be registered using the breed and colour codes for the kittens resembling the pure breed parent, and then adding the "v" code for variant. E.g.: SPHv for Sphynx variant AND SCF05v for a black Straight Eared Scottish Fold variant.
  - d. The SA Cat Register will create a Domestic Register to accommodate and support these breedings.
  - e. Entire breeding males over 18 months of age require a stud number.
  - f. If unavailable, names and breed numbers for the sire and dam of such a cat will not be required.
  - g. These cats may be shown in the Household Pet section at SACC shows.
  - h. The Show Managers may create a "Registered Cat" class for these registered Domestic and other registered pets at their discretion.
6. All Adult and Neuter finalists in annual regional competitions gain the letters RQ behind their names, denoting the title Regional Qualifier. The winners of the Adult and Neuter sections gain the letters RW behind their names, denoting the title Regional Winner.

## Tritrichomonas foetus in Cats

This is a parasite that is recognized as an emerging parasite in felines, it is thought to have had at least a decade's lead on researchers and vets.

This is just a summary but we strongly urge anyone wanting detailed information, for themselves or to take to their vet to go onto the web sites above and print the very informative papers.

**What is T. foetus**

Tritrichomonas foetus is a single-celled protozoan that likes the warm, moist and oxygen deprived conditions inside the feline colon. As it is unknown by most vets, and is consequently not routinely tested for in cats with chronic diarrhea. It looks similar to Giardia and can be misdiagnosed. Fecal floats and Giardia SNAP tests do not detect T.foetus, and T.foetus specific tests must therefore be performed to detect it. It lives for a very short time outside of the ideal colon conditions and as a result is usually missed by the normal veterinary and laboratory faecal examinations. The diagnosis is made from a direct faecal smear – there are detailed notes on collecting and testing in the clinical paper and it is essential that a positive diagnosis is made before treatment is commenced.

**Where did T.foetus come from?**

It is a well known venereal disease in cattle but there is no evidence to

suggest that feline T.foetus came from cattle. At this time veterinarians do not know how T.foetus made its way into the feline population. It is estimated that approximately 1/3 of the purebred feline population may be infected, based on a survey of cats at an international cat show.

What are the symptoms of T.foetus infection?

In cats showing symptoms T.foetus causes chronic diarrhea that is often gassy and malodorous. There may sometimes be mucous or fresh blood and some cats can be incontinent and dribble faeces from the anus.

**How do cats get T.foetus**

The primary infection pathway is most likely the litter box where a well-timed use by 2 cats can transfer the parasite from the faeces of one cat to the paws of another where they later become ingested during grooming. It appears to be a self limiting disease with the diarrhea ceasing after about 2 years – however many other cats will have been infected in the meantime!! Some cats may remain infected for life.

**Treatment**

There is no registered treatment for this parasite but one drug has been identified which the T.foetus is sensitive to. This is Ronidazole which is registered in South Africa for use in pigeons. It would seem that in the USA it comes pillled for treating cats.

It would appear that the treatment dosage is considered to be 30-50mg per kg in cats. The duration of treatment is still not totally confirmed but it would appear that the consensus is 30-50mg twice a day for 14 days.

Kyron Laboratory in South Africa now has a palatable (so they say!) liquid form available for treatment of T.foetus in cats.

It is extremely important that every cat in the household/cattery is treated.

This drug has not been extensively tested in cats and may not be administered to kittens under the age of 12 weeks or pregnant queens. On reading the clinical paper it would seem that a huge number of drugs were tested in seeking one that the T.foetus would respond to.

The adverse events reported that were considered to be serious are those associated with neurotoxicity. This included lethargy, inappetance, ataxia (the cat looks as though it is drunk and does not have control over the way it walks) or seizures.

This drug is neuro-toxic so it is very important that the cats are correctly diagnosed by a vet before treatment is commenced. *The dosage for each cat must be accurately calculated – yes every cat you treat must be individually weighed and very, very importantly all cats must be carefully observed whilst they are on the treatment and if there is any evidence of neurotoxic side effects (ataxia) the treatment must be withdrawn to avoid the risk of seizures.*

It would seem that the majority of the vets in South Africa (and it would seem as though SA is no exception reading some of the web



sites where pet owners and breeders have been seeking permanent treatment for cats with chronic diarrhea that has failed to respond to conventional treatments and does not have any conclusive lab results) are still unaware of this parasite and you may well need to take a copy of the clinical data to your vet to assist him in making an accurate diagnosis.
