

Manx



The Manx is a medium sized, compact and muscular cat. The short back, which forms a smooth continuous arch from the shoulder to the round rump, and the depth of the flanks are the strongest characteristics of the breed.

HEAD: Fairly round and large with prominent cheeks. Nose broad and straight, of medium length with a gentle break. Strong muzzle without any hint of snipyness. Firm chin and even bite.

EARS: Fairly tall, set rather high on the head and angled outwards. Open at base tapering to a narrow, rounded tip.

EYES: Fairly large and round.

BODY: Solid, compact, with good breadth of chest and short back ending in a definite round rump. The rump to be higher than the shoulder. Flanks of great depth.

LEGS: Of good substance with front legs short and well set to show good breadth of chest. Back legs longer than the front with powerful, deep thighs.

PAWS: Round with neat well-rounded toes.

TAIL:

Rumpy (Ru): Absolute taillessness is essential. The rump should be felt to be completely rounded with no definite rise of bone or cartilage interfering with the roundness of the rump.

Rumpy Riser (Rr): A rise of bone or cartilage is allowed.

Stumpy (St): A stumpy tail with a maximum length of 5 cm is allowed. This may be straight or bent.

Note: All three varieties to be exhibited in the same class and preference to be given to the Rumpy variety when all other features are equal.

COAT: Double-coated, showing a well-padded quality arising from a short, very thick undercoat and a slightly longer overcoat. The double quality of the coat is of far more importance than colour or markings, which should be taken into account only if all other points are equal.

COAT COLOUR: All colours and patterns acceptable.

EYE COLOUR: Colour preferably in keeping with coat colour.

FAULTS

Major awards may be withheld depending on the severity of the following:

- A rise of bone or cartilage at the end of the spine **in a Rumpy**.
- Lack of double coat.
- Weak chin.

Withhold major awards for:

- Definite visible rise of bone or cartilage at the end of the spine, stopping the judge's hand and interfering with the roundness of the rump **in a Rumpy**.
- Weak hindquarters causing inability to stand or walk properly.
- Uneven bite.
- Any of the defects as listed in the Relevant to all Breed section.

Allowable outcrosses:

- Cymric, British
